In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Robinson residing at the Farm called "Yellow Wood Trees" in the District of Albany being of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do hereby declare to make by this present writing my last Will and Testament in manner following (that is to say) I hereby revoke all former and other Wills and Codicils by me at any time heretofore made and do further declare to exclude from any interference with my estate all and every person and persons authority and authorities whatsoever who by the nature of their office or otherwise might or could interfere therewith save and except only the executors hereinafter named And firstly I charge all my estate and effects of which I may die possessed of with the payment of all my just debts and funeral expenses Secondly I will and direct that my immoveable property being the farm called "Yellow Wood Trees" situate in the District of Albany and whereon I now reside shall at my decease be and become the property of my son Samuel Joseph at and for the price or sum of five thousand six dollars subject however to the deduction of the sum of five hundred six dollars which shall be allowed to him from and out of the same for and in satisfaction of the expenses he has incurred in and towards erecting the house now building on the said farm the sum of four thousand five hundred six dollars remainder of the said sum of five thousand six dollars I will and bequeath as follows unto my son Samuel Joseph the sum of fifteen hundred six dollars unto my son James Edmond the sum of fifteen hundred six dollars unto my son Charles the sum of one thousand six dollars and to my son William the sum of five hundred six dollars such respective sums to be paid to my three last mentioned sons in five equal yearly payments to be computed from the period of one month after my decease but bearing no interest and in case my son Samuel Joseph shall decline to take and accept my said immoveable property in manner above mentioned and in the event of each and every of my sons also declining to take and accept the same subject to the like disposition thereof and not otherwise I will and direct that the said farm shall be sold for the best price that can be obtained for the same giving a reasonable period of time for the payment of the purchase money upon good security and the proceeds of the sale of the said farm after deduction as before stated I give and bequeath as follows unto my son Samuel Joseph out of the proceeds thereof after such deduction a sum equal to three tenths thereof a like sum to James Edmond two tenths thereof to my son Charles and one tenth to my son William Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my son Samuel Joseph two hundred ewe sheep to be run out from my flocks also one half of the lambs that I may die possessed of and one half of the milch cows and their calves Fourthly I give and bequeath unto my son James Edmond two hundred ewe sheep also to be run out from the flocks and the remainder of the milch cows and their calves one horse saddle and bridle and my bedstead two mattresses and the pillows all my bedding and my cloths chest Fifthly I give and bequeath unto my son

Samuel Joseph and James Edmond all my wearing apparel to be equally divided between them as they may agree. Sixthly I give and bequeath unto my son Charles one hundred ewe sheep Seventhly I give and bequeath unto my son William one hundred ewe sheep Eighthly I give and bequeath unto my grandchildren Mary Ann Hobson Phoebe Hobson David Hobson and Millicent Hobson two hundred ewe sheep to be equally divided amongst them and to be run out from my flocks And as to the residue of my moveable property I will and direct that the same shall be sold to the best advantage after my decease and after payment of all just debts and claims against me I give and bequeath all the surplus proceeds thereof and moneys arising therefrom unto my sons as follows (that is to say) Three eighths thereof to my son William Samuel Joseph Three eighths thereof to my son James Edmonds One eighth thereof to my son Charles and one eighth thereof to my son William And whereas I am indebted to Mr. Thomas Fried of London Hop Factor in the sum of one hundred pounds sterling I direct that my executors shall out of the proceeds of the sale of my moveable property forthwith remit and pay that amount to him at his house N^o 87 Borough London unless I shall pay the same in my lifetime And whereas I am entitled to a claim for compensation for losses sustained by the late Cape War I direct that the same whatever amount may be awarded to me in respect thereof shall be equally divided amongst my four before mentioned sons And I appoint Mr. James Collett of the District of Albany and Mr. John Cecil Wright of Graham's Town to be the Executors of this will In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand at Graham's Town the twenty ninth day of October in the year of our Lord 1839.
